DWI Defense Attorney in New York

If you are in a situation like this, the most important thing to do is to protect your rights. The officer who pulls you over will attempt to build a case of incriminating evidence against you. If you understand what your rights are now, you will know better how to act to protect your future.

What are My Rights Regarding DWI Charges?

- Your right to a [defense lawyer](#) begins as soon as you're stopped for [drunk driving](#), not just in court.
- You are not legally required to speak.
- Field Sobriety tests are designed to create enough factual evidence to proceed with chemical tests, which hold up better in court. It is not necessary for you to comply with field sobriety tests. You are also entitled to an independent blood or breath analysis.

Understanding your constitutional rights will help you to protect yourself against injustice. Consider these facts when you are facing a [criminal](#) charge.

The [fourth amendment](#) restricts law enforcement from performing unreasonable searches or seizures. Therefore, an intrusion of your vehicle or person is illegal unless a warrant is obtained in advance.

Even though there are some specific exceptions in regard to automobiles and blood alcohol levels, there are not exceptions to the warrant requirement for blood and breath tests. Consenting to a field sobriety test opens the door for police to gather enough facts to request a warrant. It is important to remember that an officer must obtain a warrant prior to administering a chemical test.

Defense Against DWI Charges

You have the right to counsel. The fifth and sixth amendments provide you the right to a [defense lawyer](#) to provide you with counsel throughout the criminal process, including both the interrogation and investigation. You should request to speak with an attorney at the time of your arrest.

Under your Miranda rights, you have the right to remain silent other than providing identifying information. If your rights are violated, you will still be tried, though a violation of these rights can eliminate consent, waivers, and other forms of incrimination, including any evidence that resulted from these infractions.

Although the steps you should take if you are charged with a DWI are straightforward, the reasons behind them are complicated.
